# Markdown

## What is Markdown?

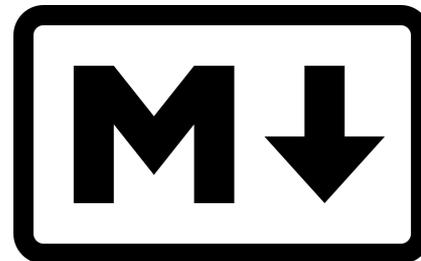
Markdown is used for both collection branding and static page creation in TIND. It is a tool that allows you to format plain text with simple “coding” directly in the text editor. It converts your text and formatting into HTML for web display, and you can use it in combination with HTML to add more complexity, such as colours, fonts and images.

### Basic syntax (Supported by TIND)

- Headings
- Bold and italics
- Lists
- Blockquotes
- Codeblocks
- Links

### Extended Syntax (TIND uses HTML for this)

- Images
- Tables
- Anchors
- ...and more!



## Get started!

1. Use an online or downloadable **Markdown editor tool** to format the text. These will usually include:
  - a. Formatting shortcuts/buttons
  - b. Preview display of formatted text
  - c. Import and export functionality
  - d. Integration with cloud storage services
2. Use a **cheat sheet** to see what formatting options are available
3. Test your result in TIND by using **hidden collections and pages**

# Adding images

We use HTML tags to display images in both the Collection Branding and Static pages.

The tag allows you to specify the size and placement of your image, and you can add an alternative text:

Images must be available online as they are referenced through a URL.

If you wish to **use a file on your computer**, you will need to upload it to a publicly accessible location on the internet. This could be your institutional website or certain cloud storage solutions like Dropbox.

If the image you wish to use is already accessible **on the internet** (and you have the right to use it), you can just reuse its URL.

## Adding images published in your repository

You can also use images directly from your records in TIND. All files have a URL in the data field 8564\_u, which you can copy by right-clicking on the “Download” button in the Files section of the record page.

# Collection Branding

Collection branding is displayed on collection pages between the collection name and the search bar. It can (for example) be used to

1. Inform your users about the resources in your collection
2. Inform your users about how they can use the resources
3. Highlight images from the collection

Good to know about collection branding

- supports languages
- is not available for main collection
- is not inherited by child collections
- Has a finite height size limit of 250px

## Mountains



A **mountain** is an elevated portion of the Earth's crust, generally with steep sides that show significant exposed bedrock.

**This is Glittertind.** Glittertind is located in the municipality of Lom, in the Jotunheimen mountain area. Glitterind is the *second highest* mountain in Norway, at 2,465 m above sea level.

# Adding Collection Branding in TIND

- To preview
  - Add a test collection without adding it to the collection tree
- Access the collection directly through the URL
  - `https://<yourinstance>.tind.io/collection/<collectionname>`
- Add your collection branding in the Collection configuration display
  - Administration → Collections → “Your collection”

# Adding Static Pages in TIND

- Find
  - Administration → Admin Center → Static Pages
- Create
  - Add new page with basic Markdown & HTML formatting
- Preview
  - Publish → Go to list → View
- Make available in menu
  - Submit a Configuration Request to TIND
- Restrict Access
  - Add “viewstaticpages” action to the role you wish to restrict access to.
  - Remove action from “anyuser”
